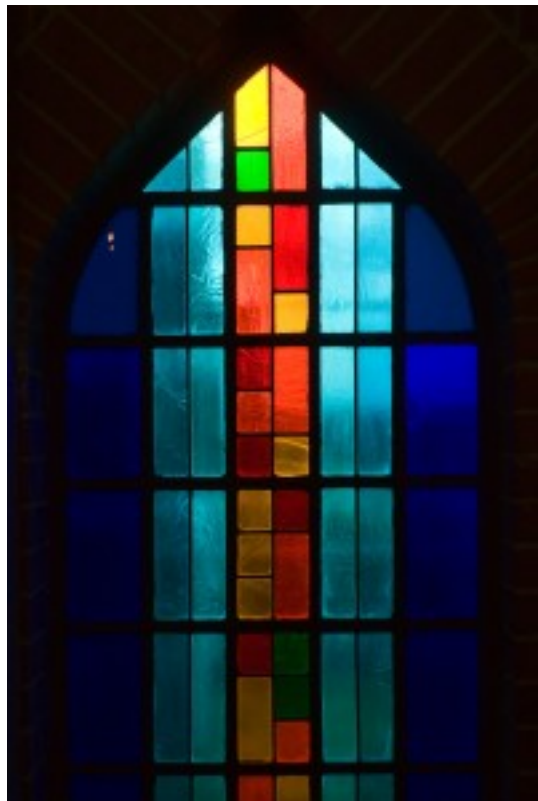


# Huntsville Center



In 1966, Lee College, under the leadership of Dean Rundell and George Beto, in cooperation with the Texas Department of Corrections, began a program of courses in the state's prison system. This program has grown from 182 students that first year to more than 1,200 students today.

A wide range of academic and technical education courses is taught by the Lee College Huntsville Center at the Texas Department of Criminal Justice — Institutional Division.
